Amen! Amen! Amen!

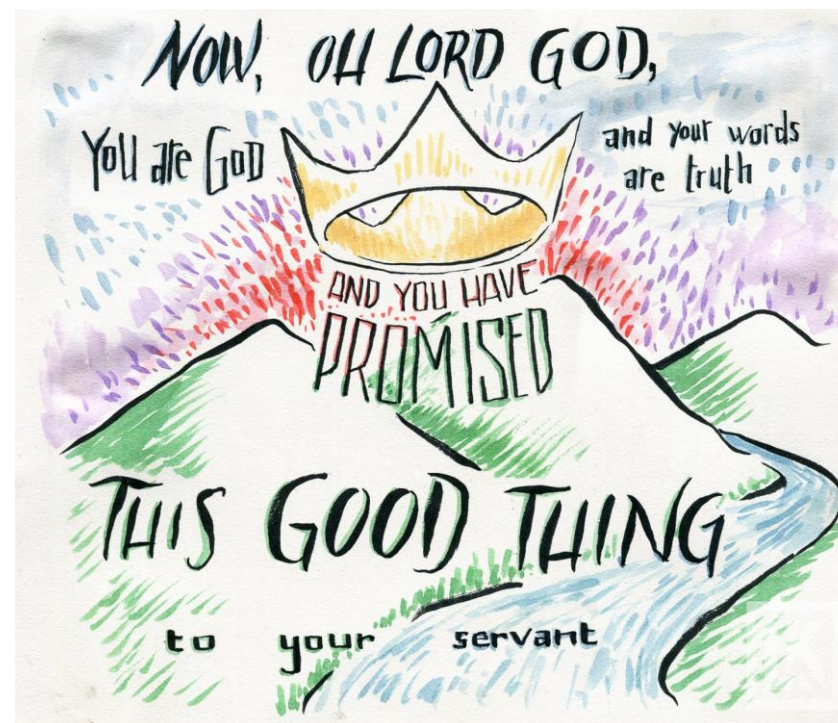
